Access to the event

The Event Village is located on Middle Common in Royal Victoria Park.

Main entrances to the Event Village are accessible and step-free.

Train Services

Great Western Railway will be running additional train services before and after the Event. For more information about Great Western Rail's Accessibility, please visit the [Passenger Assist page](#) or [National Rail's Accessible Train Travel page](#).

Bath Train Station is a 23-minute walk/push from Royal Victoria Park and is mostly flat with some incline on the one-mile journey. Please note that Bath is an historic city, with a number of cobbled streets.

Shuttle Bus Service

A shuttle bus service will be available on Event Day. This will run from Bath Racecourse – where there are several accessible parking bays that you can use – to Royal Victoria Park.

Each shuttle bus can accommodate one wheelchair. The shuttle bus service will leave you directly within the Event Village. You can find out more on our [Shuttle Bus page](#).



Local Bus Services

Most of Bath's local bus services can accommodate at least one wheelchair. There will be a few changes and diversions to normal scheduled bus services on Event Day, please ensure you stay up to date with these on the [Travel West Journey Planner](#).

Event Village

The Event Village will be mostly on grass, with trackway surfaces placed at certain locations, such as accessible toilets and near food and drink vendors.

If you need any assistance on the day, the Accessibility Team will be available to help and will be wearing purple hi-vis vests. If you require any support, please head to the Event Village Information Point.

Event Route

The Bath Half event route surface is tarmac.

As you start there is a short downhill, with a gradient of -8% and 50 feet of elevation loss. The remainder of the course is mostly flat.

As you approach the Finish Line, there is a short ascent with a maximum gradient of 6.4% and 70 feet of elevation gain.

You can find the entertainment points on the course map; these may be quite loud.

The route is a two-lap course, so please make sure you familiarise yourself with the direction of each lap by reading your Participant Event Guide.

Toilets

Toilets, including accessible toilets, will be located near the entrance to the Event Village.

On the route, there will be toilets at every Drinks Station. There will also be accessible toilets at every First Aid Point.

If your disability or health condition means you require urgent access to toilet facilities, we would recommend downloading a ['Just Can't Wait'](#) card.



Drinks Stations

Drinks Stations on the route are accessible, and volunteers will help you if required.

Accessible Viewing Areas

You can find an accessible viewing area by the Finish Line at [this What3Words location](#). The area will have a clear view of the route and will have an accessible toilet nearby. No booking is required, and spectators can bring a carer or assistant with them to this area.

Bib stickers

We have optional bib stickers with the following wording available for collection from the Information Point:

Give me space

Deaf runner

Blind runner

Visually Impaired Runner

Sensory calm space

We have a sensory calm space in the Event Village for anyone who wants to take a moment away from the crowds or the noise.

The space contains some soft seating, noise-cancelling headphones, weighted blankets and fidget toys. There will be a trained mental health first aider there to support.

British Sign Language (BSL)

We will have a BSL interpreter based at our Information Point. They will be wearing a purple hi-vis vest with 'British Sign Language Interpreter' on the back.

If you need BSL, please head to the Information Point, where our interpreter will be able to assist you.



Support/Guide Runners

We offer a free support or guide runner race place to every eligible participant – this includes blind/visually impaired runners or those with disabilities and/or medical conditions that require support or guide runners.
