

VEHICLE CROSSING POINTS

TCS London Marathon on Sunday 26 April 2026

So that the 2026 TCS London Marathon can go ahead safely, road closures will be in place across the route from 07:00 on Sunday 26 April.

To allow drivers to cross the route, we're providing 21 Vehicle Crossing Points (listed below), which will be managed by stewards throughout the day.

The crossing points will be open to vehicles until the times stated below. They will then close to allow participants in the 2026 TCS London Marathon to pass. Stewards will reopen the crossing points to vehicles once it's safe to do so.

Please note: times are approximate. Stewards will close the Vehicle Crossing Points earlier if necessary. Only emergency and event vehicles will be able to travel along the event route – all other vehicles must use the crossing points when allowed to do so.
