Getting here

The Running Show is located at Excel London, 1 Western Gateway, London E16 1XL. You can find out how to get there here: [How to get to Excel London | Travel & Transport](#)

Excel is an accessible venue, with Changing Places (requires RADAR key), mobility scooter hire, wheelchair hire, blue badge parking, hearing loops and accessible toilets. You can find out more about the venue's accessibility here: [Venue Accessibility | Excel London](#)

Disability Information Point

As you head into the venue, head left towards the New Balance space and you will find the Disability Information Point, where the Accessibility Team will be happy to help you with registration or any questions you may have.

This is also where you can collect the following bib stickers:

Give Me Space

Deaf Runner

Blind Runner

Visually Impaired Runner

You can also collect Guide Runner and Support Runner vests, as well as wheelchair flags for additional visibility on the course.

We strongly advise all wheelchair users to use flags for their own safety and visibility as well as for the safety of other participants.

Accessible Registration Desk

The last registration desk, furthest from the entrance, will be at an adjusted height for ease of access. This desk is opposite the Disability Information Point.

British Sign Language

We will have a BSL interpreter based at the Disability Information Point. They will be wearing a purple hi-vis vest with 'British Sign Language Interpreter' on the back.

All the Main Stage talks and panel discussions will have BSL interpreters present on stage.

Sensory Calm Space

We have a Sensory Calm Space, next to the Disability Information Point, for anyone who wants to take a moment away from the crowds or the noise.

This space contains beanbags and noise-cancelling headphones.

Additional Support

You can nominate someone to collect your event pack on your behalf; all they need is a copy of your ID and written consent from you authorising them to collect it on your behalf, plus their own ID.
